Tickets to be awarded by the supervising staff member.</p> <p>Examples: Organizing and running intramurals Student union Sports team manager Tutoring Peer Support Teacher Assistance School Maintenance (flowers, snow, yard cleaning, etc) Organizing and running Celebrations Parish Support (children’s’ church, maintenance)</p> <p>Students who volunteer outside of school are asked to submit a letter of reference from the supervising community member outlining the number of hours involved. 1 points per hour for community service outside of the school (not for a relative) All external community service hours must be signed off by both the school principal and the lead adult of the program.</p> <p>Examples: community instructor for younger children, Volunteering at seniors centres, etc.</p> <p>30 hours to reach standard</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Sr. High</u></p> <p>5/10/15 points for maintaining a 70%/80%/90% (respectively) average in religion.</p> <p>1 point for attendance and positive role modeling during Mass or other faith-based school functions.</p> <p>1 point for attendance and positive role modeling during community faith event.</p> <p>1 point for leadership/ participation in faith-based school functions (Leading Mass, readings, altar server, Rosary, etc.)</p> <p>15 points for attendance, active participation and positive role modeling during school retreat (adjusted at the discretion of the religion teacher and/or school administration)</p> <p>1 point per hour for community service related to the parish.</p> <p>Up to 5 points for participation in school based Youth Group.</p> <p>Up to 5 points for participation in out of school based activities. (YC, Mission trips, etc.)</p> <p>(Point distribution may be adjusted at the discretion of the religion teacher and/or school administration)</p> <p>30 points to reach standard</p>
