

THE JOAN AND DUNC GRANT SCHOLARSHIP

they have made but also for the promise they hold.*

The Joan and Dunc Grant Scholarship is made possible by the generous donation of Joan and Dunc Grant who valued hard work and commitment and is meant to recognize and support those individuals who also demonstrate these principles.

Scholarship Deadline: September 15th

Criteria: This Scholarship will be presented annually to Ponoka area students who have enrolled in a post-secondary program of studies and who meet the following criteria:

- 1) have demonstrated a solid commitment to their studies in High School or in their post-secondary program (high academic standards will be considered but is not a requirement;
- 2) have been involved in school and community service activities for the benefit of others;
- 3) have shown a significant degree of self help in achieving their goals.

Students **must** apply for this award using The Joan and Dunc Grant Scholarship Application Form. Application deadline is September 15th unless this date falls on a Saturday in which case the following Monday will be the deadline.

Eligibility: This Scholarship is made available to:

- 1) A student who is graduating from High School and entering a post-secondary program;
- 2) A student who may have taken a year off between high school and post-secondary studies;
- 3) A student who is committed to continuing their post-secondary studies.

Selection Committee: The make-up of the Selection Committee will be as follows:

- 1) The Principal of the Ponoka Composite High School who will act as a Chairperson of the Committee;
- 2) The Principal of St. Augustine School;
- 3) A Community member at large;
- 4) A Member of the Dunc Grant Family (optional, and only if a member wishes to be part of this Committee).

It is the duty of the chair to convene the Committee meetings and to make certain that Award applications are available in the schools for pick up by students. It is also the duty of the Chair to maintain the integrity of the Committee and its members. The selection of the Community member should be made in consultation with the other members of the Committee. The term of this appointment will be for four years.

Administration of Scholarship Fund:

The value of the scholarship(s) will be determined by the amount of interest generated from the endowment fund. The number of scholarships given in any particular year will be up to the discretion of the Awards Committee based on available funds. There is no obligation on the part of the Committee to disburse the award every year if a suitable candidate cannot be found.

The endowment is held by the Wolf Creek Public Schools who will report annually to the Committee the accumulated interest earned. Upon selection of the appropriate candidates, the Wolf Creek Public Schools will prepare a cheque for the scholarship winners. The Award will be presented at the Fall Award Ceremony of the school at which the student graduated from. In the event the Recipient is an ongoing post-secondary student, the Committee will make appropriate arrangements for a presentation.
